

Jacopo Torriti, Ricercatore, University of Surrey

Jacopo Torriti conducts research and teaching at the Centre for Environmental Strategy, University of Surrey. His research draws on a number of economic techniques for policy-making, such as cost-benefit analysis, macroeconomic modelling for impact assessment, demand projections, risk-benefit analysis and the standard cost model. His focus is on the application of economic forecasting tools in the energy sector and environmental policies.

Previously he was appointed as Jean Monnet Fellow at the European University Institute in Florence (2007-2008). In 2007 he worked as Economic Analyst at the Sustainable Development Commission, UK. In 2006 he was member of the Strategic Measurement and Monitoring Team, Better Regulation Executive, UK Cabinet Office. In 2002 he was Research Assistant for the Department of Economics, Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Jacopo Torriti holds a PhD from King's College London, a Master in European Studies from King's College London and an Undergraduate Degree in Economics from Università degli Studi di Milano.

Jacopo Torriti's research experience has always been intertwined with policy-making and industry. He has collaborated with, advised and provided training for a number of government bodies, including the European Commission (DG Environment and DG SANCO), the UK Cabinet Office (Better Regulation Executive), the European Institute of Public Administration, the Scuola Superiore della Pubblica Amministrazione (Italy), and the Slovenian, Latvian and Romanian Governments. He was involved in knowledge transfer work with General Electric, Pfizer, the UK General Medic Council and the UK Cooling and Heating Power Association.

He is member of the Society for Risk Analysis (Economics and Benefits/Decision Analysis Specialty Group).
